Age Limit

According to the SSC CHSL Eligibility 2025, candidates must fall within the prescribed age criteria:

- The minimum age limit is 18 years, and the maximum age limit is 27 years.
- For SSC CHSL 2025, candidates born between 02-08-1998 and 01-08-2007 are eligible to apply.
- As per the official SSC CHSL Eligibility rules, age relaxations are applicable for candidates belonging to reserved categories, as per Government of India norms.

Educational Qualification

As per the SSC CHSL Eligibility 2025, candidates must fulfill the following educational requirements:

- For Data Entry Operator (DEO)/ DEO Grade 'A' in the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, and Ministry of Culture: Candidates must have passed Class 12 in the Science stream with Mathematics as a subject from a recognized Board or its equivalent.
- For Lower Division Clerk (LDC)/ Junior Secretariat Assistant (JSA) and DEO/ DEO Grade 'A' (except DEOs in Department/ Ministry): Candidates must have passed the 12th Standard or equivalent examination from a recognized Board or University.
- Candidates who are appearing in the Class 12th exam are also eligible to apply. However, they must possess the essential qualification on or before the cutoff date as per SSC CHSL Eligibility rules.
