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Tier 2 includes a descriptive paper where candidates must write an essay and letter/application in English or Hindi. It also includes a skill or typing test depending on the post applied for.

SSC CHSL preparation strategy 2025 – Subject-Wise Approach

1. English Language

Focus Areas: Grammar, Vocabulary, Comprehension

- Read daily editorials and improve vocabulary.
- Study grammar rules from Plinth to Paramount and Wren & Martin.
- Practice cloze tests, synonyms-antonyms, and para jumbles daily.
- Revise common errors regularly to boost accuracy.

2. Reasoning (General Intelligence)

Focus Areas: Coding-Decoding, Analogy, Series, and Puzzles

- Start with basic topics like alphabet series and directions.
- Practice visual and logical reasoning from R.S. Aggarwal.
- Attempt reasoning quizzes regularly to build speed and accuracy.

3. Quantitative Aptitude

Focus Areas: Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, Data Interpretation
